The pictures by the phone box are marked on the contact sheet as Barnard Castle. They don't look like any pictures I can find of Barnard Castle on the web. The location looks like a small farming village rather than small town. Not sure why we would have the map out in Barnard Castle unless we drove to there first and then went for a walk. Maggie certainly doesn't look dressed for a trek of any distance. After much consideration I think this roll actually belongs in March 1976 when I was on a training course in Billingham (also then in County Durham) and Maggie came up on the coach for the weekend. To me that would be a hideous journey but Maggie loves buses. Travelling after work she arrived in Durham at 11.40pm. For the return journey she caught the overnight coach at 10.55 in Durham and arrived at Victoria at 6.30 the following morning. I wonder if she went straight to work from there or back to Stoke Newington first.

I remember taking the shots in Oxford St. and Maggie telling me that the chap was a familiar sight who had been patrolling with his sign board for years. I also remember taking those shots on the staircase at Liberty's.

"Less Passion from Less Protein" was a one man campaign by Stanley Green over a period of 25 years, starting in 1968. He has been called the most famous man who was never famous. He and his bill board are known the world over and appear in countless photographs. He died in 1993.
