Satterthwaite Project Day 10

**Notes:**

In 1978 while studying for a Post Graduate Certificate in Education at Garnett College I took part in project to study the economic social and political circumstances of the Lake District community in Satterthwaite.

I was the photographer for the project and one late afternoon I took a walk on my own around the village to contemplate and take some shots of the local structures.

I suspect that Pepper Cottage may be among the images but I can't match it with contemporary images found on line. Sadly all of these buildings are now run as holiday accommodation and guest houses. The problem of second home ownership and the lack of local work was already hitting the village hard in 1978 but there was still sufficient farming and forestry work to sustain a local pub. Astonishingly I didn't photograph the pub although we visited several times and chatted with the natives. The Eagles Head is, for the moment (February 2022), still there. It was refurbished as gastro-pub in in 2018 and opens 4 days a week, Thursday to Sunday, until 10pm.

The tombstones in Satterthwaite graveyard are particularly poignant in respect of Alan Dugdale, some of whose history I have already recounted in the notes to roll 7108.

Among the gravestones is memorial to Alan Dugdale's mother Martha Agnes who died 15th August 1961 aged 73, his father John 10th April 1970 aged 87 and his brothers John and Richard Edward who both died in infancy. John, born in 1910, died at 6 years old in 1916, Richard's birth and death were both registered in same month, September 1913.

Harold Brocklebank, father of Thomas Geoffrey Brocklebank, bought The Grizedale Estate 1903 and sold it to the Forestry Commission in 1937.
