Lamp posts, street signs, walls, fences, control boxes, bridges, underpasses, post boxes anything with a stable surface to which paint will adhere is used by those careless or contemptuous of the work of engineers, craftsmen and ordinary working men, insensitive to the sensibilities of residents they appear to wish to create a legacy, such as it is, for themselves. I am not as you might have guessed, a fan of the anarchic creation of graffiti in public spaces.

A couple of shots at the start of Radcliffe Road by David Drew Garages and on the bridge then down to the embankment and the what are in truth, railway arches from around 1879, but now support the Lady Bay road bridge.

None of the stuff I photographed is "good" graffiti, it's not special, it does not represent exceptional talent. It's just the ordinary common or garden graffiti that blights communities in the built environment.

After taking the pictures I strolled along the river around the Hook which was totally deserted and headed for the Poppy and Pint by way of Mick and Sue's on Gertrude Road.

I was the only patron of the pub garden for over an hour. The bar was lamentably deserted and so cold from the overactive air-con, despite the open windows, that you wouldn't want to sit there without at least a good fleece and possibly a warm hat.

It was a beautiful breezy summer's day such as might be longed for by many.




